Opportunities to help FIDO protect K'gari and Great Sandy Strait

There has been a huge amount of activity swirling around FIDO since the issue of our MOONBI newsletter last month. Many projects such as the hugely successful Easter Cassia Blitz at Happy Valley came to fruition after almost a year on planning. Other long anticipated activities such as our proposed Northern Cooloola BioBlitz have finally received the requisite permits to enable the first to proceed 24-26 August.

This newsletter is providing a heads-up on how FIDO's diverse campaigns and projects are progressing.

Other activities FIDO have been engaged in include:

- developing a very comprehensive submission to the Fraser Coast Regional Council on the future of waste management on K'gari;
- moving ahead with planning for the 2019
   Community Collaborations and Culture
   Conference that FIDO is collaborating with the
   Butchulla Aboriginal Corporation to organize.;
- following up the research needed on Great Sandy Strait to convince the authorities on the potential environmental damage that might result if the proposed Colton Coal mine proceeds;
- participating in the rich flow of new information, ideas and thinking flowing from the University of the Sunshine Coasts K'gari Symposium at their Fraser Coast Campus on 7-8 June;
- producing a presentation on the History of Contestation for the Symposium that is now about to go on line.;
- completing a comprehensive Easter Cassia Blitz that has obliterated this colourful and conspicuous invasive weed that has spread into Happy Valley's surrounding bush;
- planning ahead for the future of FIDO with a professional CEO and with the administrative core being much closer to K'gari to have our ears much closer to the ground when playing our watchdog role.



#### **Waste Management Submission**

The Fraser Coast Regional Council is working on the Fraser Coast Future Waste Project. The cost and logistics of attending the scheduled workshops at Kingfisher Resort prevented FIDO's direct discussions on the project. The process though provided FIDO an opening to prepare a very comprehensive submission to the Council on the whole expensive and messy business of handling the waste generated by humans on K'gari. There are many aspects of FIDO's Waste Management Strategy. They range from landscaping the Happy Valley Waste Transfer Station to the dealing with putrescible waste. FIDO believes that the priority for any long-term waste management requires dealing with putrescible waste. FIDO proposes that composters be installed in Eurong, Happy Valley and Orchid Beach. As a result of FIDO's very real concerns for biosecurity, FIDO proposes that all vehicles should be inspected prior to going on to the ferries. This may also help to reduce the volume of waste being produced. FIDO's submission is expected to be finalized within two weeks and be posted on the FIDO website.

#### FIDO's Future

As FIDO approaches its 50th birthday, now only 19 months away, the Executive is actively working on plans to reshape and renew the organization. Succession planning is now well advanced because the Executive believes that it is essential that Fraser Island (Kgari) continues to have a strong watchdog organization monitoring island activities independent of government. FIDO's planning though is contingent on being able to secure sufficient financial resources to make it happen and strengthening its membership base.

Key points in the Executive's current considerations are that the organization needs a professional CEO and that the organization relocates its administrative centre much closer to K'gari. To enable this to happen within the next 19 months FIDO is pulling out all stops to make it happen.

#### **USC Symposium**

The University of the Sunshine Coast held its **sharing knowledge, sharing understanding**K'gari-Fraser Island Symposium at its Fraser Coast campus on 7-8 June. FIDO's contribution was a presentation on the *History of Contestation* by John Sinclair. It covered a range of contests since the first European contacts with the region from political, commercial and land-use contests. This history complements Sinclair's insider's *History of K'gari and Cooloola*. The *Contestation* presentation and his speaker's notes have been now paced on FIDO's web site: www.fido.au

#### **Great Sandy Strait Research**

FIDO's priority project to protect the natural integrity of K'gari, Great Sandy Strait and Cooloola remains ensuring that fish caught in the Great Sandy Region and all other living life are not going to be polluted. The threat arises from the huge volume of contaminated mine water that is proposed to be discharged from the planned 50 metre deep opencut Colton Coal Mine into the Mary River.

As part of the research into the movement of waters and sediment, the Great Sandy Strait Research Oversight Committee is negotiating with three post-doctoral university researchers to get an Initial assessment underway into the *Hydrodynamics & Materials Transport in the Mary River Estuary*.

It is hoped that the study that we expect to be finalized about February will establish what, if any, impact the discharge of Colton Mine will have on the Ramsar Site that is already included on the Interim

World Heritage List.

### Citizen Scientists to Blitz Northern Cooloola

Rainbow Beach will host an exciting BioBlitz based around Northern Cooloola on the weekend of 24-26 August as a result of a collaboration between the Fraser Island Defenders Organisation and Cooloola Coastcare.

The ambitious citizen science project aims to document as much of the areas's living natural resources — plants, animals, invertebrate, fungi and more in a challenge that is open to anyone with an interest in natural history irrespective of their expertise.

Cooloola Coastcare's Dr Lindy Orwin, who is coordinating the BioBlitz arrangements, said that it was anticipated that over 100 participants from South East Queensland and beyond would include complete novices to experts with experts helping the less experienced identify and learn more about nature in the process.

FIDO's CEO John Sinclair, who organized a BioBlitz on Fraser Island (Kgari) two years ago said that he was excited to see a BioBlitz happening in Cooloola because it was much more accessible and as a result he expected much more participation.

"Being spread over the 24 to 26 August weekend in early spring when the bush is blooming with new life, we expect a much younger group of BioBlitzers who are eager to learn about the weird and wonderful aspects of nature to join the quest to discover as much as possible and to learn from some very experienced mentors," Dr. Sinclair said.

"Cooloola is already on the World Heritage Tentative List and this citizen science project will help build the case to enable it to be elevated to join its sister sandmass on the other side of Great Sandy Strait as one of the recognized great wonders of the natural world." he added.

He said that the partnership between FIDO and Cooloola Coastcare would not only add to the knowledge of Cooloola's living natural resource but would provide baseline data to be compared with information from future BioBlitzes anticipated over the next three years.

Dr. Orwin added that now that the necessary approvals had been granted planning for the event was now in full swing and that details would soon be posted on the web sites of both hosting organizations.
