FIDO- 'The Watchdog of Fraser Island' aims to ensure the wisest use of Fraser Island's natural resources

- FIDO has tackled invasive weed species since 2005
- Encouraging the use of locally sourced, salt tolerant, native species
- However, the aforementioned species were NOT available on Fraser Island




So Why Not Just Bring Them In?

"What is good for the land comes first. If you have plenty you must share.

Do not touch or take anything that does not belong to you."

In respect of the Butchulla people's beliefs, it is **vital** that no propagation is taken from or brought to Fraser Island



All genetic material – seed and cuttings are sourced within the Eurong Township



Eurong Nursery 2015

Location: QPWS (Queensland Parks & Wildlife Service) grounds. North of the Eurong Township.

Management: Was previously run by National Parks but management has since been handed over to FIDO

Nursery Features Include:

- · A Timed Watering System
- Tunnels for Propagation
- Sun Hardening Area
- Space for Plant Growth



Sourcing Equipment

These items are essential for the Eurong Nursery to operate effectively.

- Utensils for Propagation Op Shop
- Sieves for Seed Cleaning Op Shop
- · Black Plastic for Bench Covering Donated
- Trays for Pots Donated
- Esky for Seeds Donated
- 1000's of Pots Australia Zoo

I then compiled a list of possible seed to be collected ...



Volunteers At The Nursery

FIDO

- Visit Eurong three times per year
- Each trip lasting one week
- Invest time in: seed and cutting collection, propagation, pot washing, weeding and nursery repairs
- Recently created additional bench space
- Hope to create a pot washing station, this October

Green Army Team

- Built a potting bench from a disused pallet
- Had the opportunity to teach them about seed collection, propagation and other general nursery duties





Increasing The Plant Diversity

In six short visits to K'Gari = Substantial increase in the Nursery's Species Diversity

October 2015

• 14 species collected

Plant stock numbers vary, as plants can go to new homes between trips

July 2016

• 38 species in total

We now have 100's of plants available in the Nursery

July 2017

• 53 species collected, sowed and potted



So Where Are The Plants Going?

- Since 2016 FIDO has established three new Demonstration Gardens
- Maintained and added to existing Demonstration and other Gardens within the Eurong Resort Grounds
- Revegetation by FIDO
- Eurong locals
- · National Parks Officers



My Vision For The Future Of The Eurong Nursery

- Attain permission and permits, to collect propagation material from further afield
- Stock the plants contained in the FINIA publication 'The Fraser Island Native Planting Guide'
- Increase plant demand and turnover
- To collaborate with the Traditional Owners, the Butchulla people
- Establish a Demonstration Garden based on bush tucker plants
- Community Hub- volunteer opportunities, new skills, making connections, strengthening the community
